Student Safety: GSACRD VOICE (MHCB) wellness coach, youth success coach, and school counsellor provide lessons to classes as well as small groups on a variety of mental health issues. Social and Emotional programming such as; GoZen, Kimochis, slumberkins, Big Life Journal and Worry Woos, ensures safety, belonging, connection, emotional regulation, social skills, mindfulness, positive affirmations, weekly Monday Mission focuses.. Counseling services are available two days a week for small group targeted support and provide at the elbow support for classroom teachers. Youth Success Coach provides regular check-ons with students for social emotional regulation and goal setting four days a week. Positive behaviour school wide expectations – SPRR – Safe, Proud, Respectful, Responsible. SPRR students are recognized weekly by staff with SPRR positive support tickets and monthly school wide assembly celebration with certificates and prizes.			Student Engagement: Staff are committed to continuing to incorporate the Practice Progressions in all of their lessons, along with the creation of engaging literacy and numeracy lessons.		
			Permeation: At Legal School, we continue to celebrate our faith through liturgies, prayers, virtues programs and connections with our parish community. We demonstrate love by serving our community through social justice projects where students are provided with opportunities to serve others. With the support of our school Faith Lead, Division Chaplain and Division Religion Consultant, students will be engaged in faith-based learning opportunities where they will learn to see themselves and each other as children of God. Students have opportunities to build community relationships with the local parish priest and the CWL by attending special masses throughout the school year and by having the parish priest celebrate liturgies at the school. Bi-monthly visits by the local parish priest to have donuts and conversations with students.			Inclusive Learning: Continuing to provide equitable access to technology, differentiated lessons, hands-on learning, and positive behaviour support. Staff regularly engage in collaborative team meetings that focus on students and how we can best reach all learners. IPP meetings with guardians provide opportunities for them be actively involved in their child's learning.					
			Service: Legal School students and staff are called to GROW IN LOVE. Legal School students and staff serve those in need through social justice projects throughout the year by projects such as feeding the hungry by supporting the Gibbons Food Bank and collecting items for the Christmas Hamper Project for the Community of Legal. We support those in need by contributing to various projects through Catholic Social Services. Through relationships and conversations with students and their families, we can identify those in need and support them through our Nutrition program.			Foundational Knowledge of First Nations, Métis and Inuit: Staff participate in professional learning with a focus on reconciliatory actions and building foundational knowledge related to the 94 Calls to Action and learn from First Nations, Metis and Inuit culture and perspectives. We create meaningful and engaging activities to acknowledge Métis Week, National Truth and Reconciliation Day and National Indigenous People's Day. Our staff, in collaboration with Waniska Leads, will create a three-year plan to build meaningful lessons for staff and students with a focus on Indigenous ways of knowing, being and doing.
