
Open the eyes of our hearts!

Let Us Pray...

Praying with Scripture (<u>Lectio Divina</u>)

P.R.R.R. method (yup, like a cat in the Father's lap!)

Prepare: Grab a Bible, a quiet place, calm your mind and pray, "God, let me hear you".

Read: Choose a verse (like Psalm 23) and read slowly; focusing on what you see, hear, feel, and think,

Reflect: Re-read 2 more times, then ask, "What is God saying to me?"

Respond: Pray to God, thank Him or journal your

thoughts.

Rest: Sit quietly (5-10 mins), listening to God.
