Explanation of General Fees

Technology Support This fee is used to offset some of the costs associated with software licenses and website subscriptions such as Spelling City, Exam Bank, Raz Kids, etc.

Students' Union Fee The Student Union group plans and organizes activities for all students in the school. The fee covers the costs of speakers, theme and activity day supplies, and prizes for student contests and participation.

Dynamic Option Fees Every student in Grades 4-9 will take Dynamic Option classes twice per week. Some classes require consumables and supplies in order to offer the course.

Junior High Option Course Fee Each Junior High student is enrolled in a selection of complementary courses. Some courses require consumables and supplies in order to offer the course. Any field trips associated with the option will be a separate cost and communicated at a later date.

Supervision Fee This fee is collected for the wage of a supervisor during the lunch hour. We have been able to maintain one supervisor this year, but may need to increase to two (as in the past) depending on school staffing.

Legal School Options Information

Dynamic Options:

Students at Legal School are offered the opportunity to participate in Dynamic Options in grades 4-9. Dynamic Options follow several curriculums including Career and Technology Foundations (CTF), Second Languages, Physical Education, and 21st Century Core Competencies. Students are able to choose from a number of different courses throughout the year to develop their skills in a variety of areas.

Junior High Options:

Our Junior High students continue to be offered an array of complementary course options to supplement their education and provide them with 21st Century life skills that will transfer to the world of work.

COVID-19 Option Adaptations:

We are continuing to offer options this year, however, they are modified in order to comply with the requirements of Alberta Health Services, Alberta Education, and Greater St. Albert Catholic Schools. **All options will be \$10.00 per term**, unless otherwise stated. In an effort to keep our cohorts separate, we are only offering one option choice for grades 4-6 and one for grades 7-9 with the exception of Hockey and Recreation options. Hockey and Rec will run as they have in the past, minus the field trips. The Hockey and Rec staff will endeavor to keep the cohorts separate in their classes.

The options listed below may or may not be offered based on student choice. The option teachers, in consultation with administration, are giving students choice within the option. Students may be working on a variety of choices during their option time. For example, they may choose to do art, Genius Hour and drama all within one option. The staff are doing our best to accommodate student choice, given the restraints we have this year.

Course Descriptions - Dynamic Options and Junior High Options:

Hockey - The prerequisite for this program is that the students must know how to skate and have an ability to handle the puck while skating (students do not have to be enrolled in an organized hockey program outside of the school to participate). The students will also be responsible for having equipment, although please check with the school if you are needing to borrow any equipment. Students are responsible for sharpening their own skates. Students in this option will be divided by skill level on the ice while working on individual skills in skating, stick handling, shooting, game play, sportsmanship, and fundamentals of hockey and fitness. Students in hockey option will follow the Alberta Physical Education curriculum. If you choose hockey as your option, you will not choose any other Dynamic option courses.

Recreation/Outdoor Pursuits- Students in Rec option will participate in a variety of activities that use natural and commonly found places, objects, and environments to learn to stay healthy and fit. Activities will include, but are not limited to, cross country skiing, snowshoeing, curling, skating, broomball, playground challenges, hiking, frisbee games, etc. Students in recreation option will follow the Alberta Physical Education curriculum. If you enroll in Recreation Option, you will not choose any other Dynamic option courses.

Drama - In drama class, students will engage in a variety of activities appropriate to their age level, including game play, dramatic movement, acting, and improvisation skills. Students in drama will follow the Alberta Education Fine Arts Program of Studies.

Driver's Education: Students will demonstrate and understand licence qualifications in preparation for their Learner's License. Students will follow the CTF curriculum for Driver's Education.

Food: Food's class offers an opportunity to develop "hands on" life skills! Learn about safety and hygiene in the kitchen and to prepare fast and nutritious foods based on Canada's Food Guide. Students will follow the CTF curriculum for Foods.

Photography: Students will explore photographic methods and demonstrate basic competencies with photography, graphic arts, photoshop, light and shadow, etc. Students will use the CTF curriculum.

Art: This option allows students to work with a variety of materials in order to develop skill in drawing, painting, sculpting, visual arts, etc. Students will use the Alberta Education program of studies for Fine Arts.

Sports Medicine – this course is designed to educate students interested in fields such as athletic training, physical therapy, medicine, fitness, physiology of exercise, kinesiology, nutrition and other sports medicine fields. Students are assessed using the physical education and health curricula.
