#### **Our Sentence:**

At Legal School, every staff member enacts our mission and vision as a faith-based community through Christ-centered relationships to create a welcoming, nurturing, environment where students and staff are engaged in lifelong, supported and safe learning.

Students will recognize and identify the need for service within their community by seeing themselves and others as children of God

Legal staff will provide lessons to improve engagement and create robust learning opportunities for students, particularly in the areas of literacy and numeracy.

\*Grade 9 PAT results - Due to the low number of grade 9 students enrolled at Legal School for the 2018/2019 school year, percentage reporting is inaccurate and misleading. Overall, grade 9 students performed at the acceptable level on all 4 core subjects. Teachers continue to engage, support, and differentiate for all students in grade 9.

### **Division Satisfaction Results:**

Students and parents reported high levels of satisfaction with Legal School's teaching strategies, expectations, wellness, technology and media safety, and access to information. Parents also report that staff model how to live like Jesus, that their children learn about service to others, and that they feel welcome in the school.

#### Permeation:

Faith is permeated at Legal School through daily common classroom prayers, interactions with each other, partnership with the parish, religion classes, and virtues program. With the support of our school Faith Lead, Division Chaplain and Division Religion Consultant, students will be engaged in faith-based learning opportunities where they will learn to see themselves and each other as children of God

- 1. Due to COVID restrictions, we have changed our Monday morning whole school assembly to three Virtues Classes to respect our cohort groupings. Our focus in these classes is prayer and faith, introducing the theme of the week or continuing the month's theme (ie: Month of Mary). We also focus on community building and virtues that support lessons in Religion and Citizenship classes.
- 2. Students continue to lead masses, liturgies, and celebrations.
- 3. Purposeful and intentional use of the chapel for prayer, reflection, and religion classes.
- 4. Continue to celebrate those students who have completed their sacraments.
- 5. School-wide retreat (respecting cohorts) where each teacher leads with a testimonial and creates a station with an activity that focuses on Arise: Get Up, Get Going and Go with God!

### Serving the Oppressed and Those in Need:

- With the support of Legal Student Council, religion and citizenship classes, Legal students are deepening their understanding of what it means to be a child of God and to see God in others.
- Our service projects will focus on local and global causes such as supporting the Gibbons/Bon Accord Food Bank, the Knights of Columbus hamper drive at Christmas, the CWL, the Jessica Martel centre, Catholic Social Services, and Development and Peace. Due to COVID restrictions. our grandparent program with Chateau Sturgeon is suspended until further notice. Students also take time to serve their community by shoveling walks, picking up garbage, weeding flower beds, etc.
- Grocery cards for families in need
- Coats and school supplies for families who need them
- Religion and Citizenship classes are scheduled at the same time to facilitate student involvement in service projects
- Staff Retreat "The Reset Button"restoring our hearts and reconnecting to the life promised in the Gospel

#### **Student Strengths:**

### Hope:

Area of Strength – 88% of our students report that they have many goals and 89% report that they will find a good job in the future.

#### **Engagement:**

Area of Strength – Students report that their overall involvement in and enthusiasm for school increased by 14% from 2017 to 2018.

#### Well-being:

Legal School staff will continue to focus on the following strategies to increase, as well as, help students maintain mental and physical well-being:

Mindfulness, Zones of Regulation, peer relationship education and support (antibullying), Student Council Theme Days and weeks to improve morale.
