Celebrating Our Faith
Celebrations: Gr. 4 Bible Presentation & Thanksgiving Mass at St. Emile Parish (Religion Classes) Remembrance Day Ceremony & Liturgy (whole school) Weekly Advent Liturgy in the Chapel (each Religion Class) Ash Wednesday Liturgy in the Chapel (each Religion Class) Easter Liturgy (whole school) Year End Mass at St. Emile Parish (whole school) Father Lester from St. Emile Parish presides over our liturgies when possible. Students will continue to lead masses, liturgies, and celebrations. With a continuation of purposeful and intentional use of the chapel for prayer, reflection, and for Religion classes.
Permeation: At Legal School we continue to celebrate our faith through liturgies, prayers, virtues programs and connections with our parish community. We ARISE to serve our community through social justice projects where students are provided with opportunities to serve others. With the support of our school Faith Lead, Division Chaplain and Division Religion Consultant, students will be engaged in faith-based learning opportunities where they will learn to see themselves and each other as children of God. Students have opportunities to build community relationships with the local parish priest and the CWL by attending special masses throughout the school year and by having the parish priest celebrate liturgies at the school.
Service: Legal School students and staff are called to ARISE, GET UP, GET GOING AND GO WITH GOD. Legal School students and staff serve those in need through social justice projects throughout the year by projects such as feeding the hungry by supporting the Gibbons Food Bank and collecting items for the Christmas Hamper Project for the Community of Legal. We support those in need by contributing to the various projects through Catholic Social Services. Through relationships and conversations with students and their families, we are able to identify those in need and support them through our Nutrition program.

Safe and Caring Schools
Student Safety: -GSACRD VOICE (MHCB) wellness coach and counselor provide lessons to classes as well as small groups on a variety of mental health issues. Social and Emotional programming such as; GoZen, Kimochis, slumberkins, Big Life Journal and Worry Woos, This ensures safety, belonging, connection, emotional regulation, socialization skills, mindfulness, and positive affirmations. -Counseling services available two days a week for one-one and small groups. - Family Support Worker joins our Learning Team meetings every second month to support families in Legal. - Using a Restorative Justice approach while trying to improve relationships amongst our students for a sense of safety and belonging. - <u>Positive Behaviour support model</u> – SPRR – Safe, Proud, Respectful, Responsible. SPRR students are recognized regularly by staff with SPRR positive support tickets and each term with a celebration, games, certificates and prizes and special lunch celebrations.
Inclusive Learning: -Continuing to provide equitable access to technology, differentiated lessons, hands on learning, and positive behaviour support. Staff regularly engage in collaborative team meetings that focus on the students and how we can best reach all of our learners. IPP meetings with parents invites parents to be part of their child's unique learning styles
Foundational Knowledge of First Nations, Métis and Inuit: Staff participate in professional learning with a focus on reconciliatory actions and building foundational knowledge related to the 94 Calls to Action and learn from First Nations, Metis and Inuit culture and perspectives. We create meaningful and engaging activities to acknowledge Metis Week, National Truth and Reconciliation Day and National Indigenous People's Day. Our staff faith retreat was held at Metis Crossing where the staff engaged in hands-on learning and storytelling activities and then shared this experience with our students and school community.
Citizenship: AB ED survey results indicate that students, parents and staff are satisfied that students model the characteristics of active citizenship. Division survey results demonstrate that religion class helps students to know and live like Jesus Christ. The learning focus of the virtues for the month and students participation in citizenship activities that give back to the school and community help foster citizenship skills for the students at Legal School.

Engaged Learning
Student Engagement: Staff are committed to continue to incorporate the Practice Progressions in all of their lessons, along with the creation of engaging literacy and numeracy lessons. Percentage of students who agree that they are engaged in their learning at school: Legal - 58.2% Alberta - 71.8% Legal School students report that they understand the importance of the subjects that they are learning and that their classes are interesting to them (data source - Alberta Education Assurance Measure).
Parent Involvement: Teachers at Legal School report that parents understand the importance of the subjects that they are learning and that their classes are interesting to them (data source - Alberta Education Assurance Measure). Parents are welcomed and encouraged to participate in their child's learning through Meet the Staff Night, Teacher Nights, IPP meetings, as well as various volunteer opportunities throughout the year. Legal School has a dedicated School Council and Friends Of Legal School Society who meet regularly to support the school and the community as a whole.
School Improvement: Staff at Legal School are continually learning new pedagogy and best practices in teaching and engage in goal setting that is data driven and create strategies and learning opportunities that improve student learning. Staff in elementary participated in a series of learning sessions from Layers of Literacy 5 Part Session in Jan/Feb. 2022, and Structured Literacy Training from Dr. George Georgiou. Some of our students in grade 1-3 were part of the literacy intervention program last year and after 5 staff were trained in the intervention program we were able to transfer this knowledge and training to other grade levels and students for additional literacy support.
